I left Allegany
as you well know in the rain

left me and I had a fine day

a shanty then I knew I was wrong
I then went back to my starting
point & followed another for
about 1/2 mile made up my mind
that I was wrong & took another
and went to Knapp Brook then
came back & took the right one
and came out on Foster Brook
about 4 o'clock P.M.
