EXAMINATIONS.

At the close of each term there will be a public exam. ination of all the classes. Exhibition at the close of the Spring term. Anniversary of the Philomathean Society at the close of the Summer term.

INSTRUCTION:

THE first four days of the week will be devoted to ad. vance lessons. Friday is review day, and Saturday will in future be devoted to Compositions and Declamations. Gentlemen are required to declaim and write each alternate week, Ladies to write once in two weeks. The object of the course of instruction given in this Institution, is to commence a thorough system of education, and to continue it while the Student remains. That education alone is thorough, which developes and disciplines all the faculties, and trains the morals, manners and intellect Parents are earnestly reminded, that one of the greatest hindrances to perfect scholarship, is the want of punctuality, both at the beginning and during term time. The loss of even a few lessons, will be felt for many weeks, and one absence will often result in the total discourage.

RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION.

PRAYERS are attended in the Assembly Room every morning with the reading of the Scriptures, and all the Students are required to be present.

LECTURES.

The natural Sciences are from time to time, illustrated by lectures and the use of the apparatus. Also during the winter term, students will have free access to a course of literary and scientific lectures.

LIBRARY AND APPARATUS.

During the past year a good library has been procured. It has been selected with the greatest care and in addition to Standard Authors, contains many recent and valuable works; among which is a complete Set (18 vol.) of the Natural History of the State of New York. Additions will be made to it from time to time as the prosperity of the Institution will warrant. The Apparatus for the illustration of the sciences, has been purchased with direct reference to its suitableness, durability and perfection of finish.

LITERARY SOCIETY.

For the purpose of securing to themselves literary and social advantages, the Teachers and Students have or ganized the Philomathean Society, to which any student of the Academy is elligible.

TEACHERS' CLASS.

Provisions have been made in this Academy by the Regents of the University for the instruction of twenty. five teachers for one third of the year. A teachers' class will be organized at the beginning of the full term, which will receive thorough discipline; the course prescribed by the State. At the close of the term, those qualified for teaching will receive a certificate to that effect from the Principal.

BOARD AND ROOMS.

Board may be obtained in respectable families, from \$1,25 to \$1,50 per week. Rooms have been fit up in the basement story of the Academy for those wish to board themselves, which may be procured \$1,50 per term, to each student.
